### Summary:

The Utah Broadband Advisory Council held its inaugural meeting to discuss broadband adoption and deployment in the State of Utah and will provide the Governor and Legislature with recommendations and policy guidance. Bert Granberg presented on the Utah Geographic Reference Center's (AGRC) new population data map that may be used to identify unserved areas of the state. Sharon Bertelsen gave an update on federal regulatory and legislative issues. Issues addressed by members of the Council that may be discussed in further detail are:

- Possible update to S.B. 29 "Sales and Use Exemption – Telecommunications"
- Strategies to improve coordination between cities and counties
- Incentives/subsidies and methods of securing sustainable funding
- Defining a statewide goal for broadband speeds in Utah
- Developing recommendations to improve interoperability for 9-1-1 services
- Developing strategies to encourage providers to improve redundancy
- Developing strategies to support Universal Service Fund (USF) reform that will help deploy broadband in Utah
